



SINGLE VINEYARD WINE

The term “single vineyard wine” may only be used for wine produced from grapes derived from a unit officially registered for the production of single vineyard wine. Such a unit must consist of a 100% single variety and the area may not exceed 6 hectares (roughly 15 acres)

ESTATE WINE

An estate wine of a particular estate must be produced solely from grapes harvested on the estate concerned. The wine must be grown, made and bottled on such estate. This has to 100% from the Estate and no % of wine can be bought or brought in. The vineyard and winery has to be on one designated continuous piece of land.

A Ward Specific wine has to be made from one designated ward with the Wine of Origin scheme. A wine cannot be bottled as Regional wine i.e Stellenbosch, if the grapes are grown in more than one ward. The largest accepted designation for a Site Specific wine is made from grapes from the same ward.



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
